Administrative Note

The Pentecost Mission for Adult Catechesis was one of the original divisions of the John Paul II Center for the New Evangelization when it was created in 2007. It provided academic courses to the laity and those seeking certification for catechetical ministry. Courses covered subjects such as Christology, church history, Hebrew scriptures, the New Testament, moral theology, Catholic social teaching, ecclesiology, and liturgy and sacraments. It was a bilingual program that served English and Spanish speaking Catholics. The Pentecost Mission moved under the umbrella of Cardinal Stritch University in June, 2008.

This collection contains general information about the Pentecost Mission. Also included are faculty directories, registration, attendance records, correspondence, and course schedules.
