Scope and Contents

Celia Klein Rose was the great-granddaughter of the Prasch family, a pioneer family in Burlington, Wisconsin. These memoirs, written in 1930, tell of Celia's recollections of family and church life in that town from the mid-late 19th century. Her family members were founding members of Immaculate Conception (St. Mary) Church, Burlington, Wisconsin.
