This collection includes items related to Fr. Gundrum's ordination that were donated by his younger sister and niece. This includes a bride's dress worn by his sister, Marian Gundrum, and a page boy outfit worn by his nephew, Kenneth Schaefer, at his first Mass in June, 1941. There are also several photographs.

Biographical Note

Rev. Anthony J. Gundrum was a priest of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. He was born July 5, 1915 in Milwaukee, but his family relocated to Slinger, WI. He attended St. Lawrence College in Mount Calvary and St. Francis Seminary. He was ordained to the priesthood May 31, 1941. He was the associate pastor of St. Anthony in Milwaukee from 1941 to 1945, and at St. Mary's in Port Washington from 1945-1957. He was the pastor of St. Andrew in Leroy from 1957 to 1980, and St. John the Baptist in Clyman from 1980 to May, 1987. He died on September 28, 1987 and is buried in St. Andrew's Cemetery, Leroy, Wisconsin.
